

## USING THE TRANSFER STATION

*Only residents of Killingworth may use the Transfer Station, and only for private household waste. Do not bring waste generated by a commercial enterprise.*

To bring your trash to the Transfer Station, you must display a current town sticker on your vehicle's windshield. A sticker is good for only one vehicle. Each household is entitled to stickers for two vehicles.

Stickers are available at the

- Tax Collector's Office, Town Hall, during regular business hours. Bring current registration for each vehicle.
- The Transfer Station office, during normal hours of operation.

To obtain stickers, you must fill out a registration form and present your vehicle registration. The form is available on line at [www.townofkillingworth.com](http://www.townofkillingworth.com); to save time, print it out and bring it with you.

When you sell your vehicle, be sure to remove the town sticker. Even if the new owner lives in Killingworth, a new sticker will be required.

Remember, through our taxes we pay for each pound of trash we dispose of; when nonresidents use our transfer station, we are paying for their free ride.

## KEEP KILLINGWORTH CLEAN, GREEN, AND IN THE BLACK

Killingworth pays by the ton for solid waste disposal, but we get paid a small amount for every ton of recyclables. So the more we recycle, the lower our taxes.

Scavenging is not permitted, except in the designated area nearest the exit.

In addition to the recyclables you can bring to the Transfer Station, many items can be kept out of the household waste bins:

- Table scraps can be composted. You can find information through such websites as [nrcs.usda.gov](http://nrcs.usda.gov).
- Plastic bags can be brought back to most supermarkets; better yet, bring reusable bags when you shop.
- Paint in containers with labels – both latex and oil-based – should be brought to a PaintCare drop-off location such as Killingworth True Value.
- Used books can be donated to the Killingworth Library.
- Old eyeglasses are collected by the Lions Club in boxes around town.

Killingworth's Transfer Station is more user friendly than almost any other town's. Let's keep it that way.

## SOLID WASTE

Household trash, including soiled newspapers, pizza boxes, Styrofoam packing material, plastic bags.

**Hazardous waste:** Household hazardous waste (HHW) — mercury thermometers, pesticides, and pool chemicals—should be brought to the Estuary Region collection facility: Route 9, Exit 4, Dump Road, Essex. 2018 collection dates are:

**E-Waste:** Residential electronics, including televisions, computers, monitors, and printers, may be recycled in a container at the Transfer Station. Be sure to wipe out any personal information from your hard drive, or destroy your hard drive, before you deposit it. If you have commercial e-waste, please see the Transfer Station Supervisor before you deposit the items.

## RECYCLING

**Paper and cardboard:** No plastic bags, shredded paper. Acceptable items:

- Clean newspaper
- Corrugated cardboard, including printed or shiny
- Boxboard, such as cereal and cracker boxes; remove cellophane windows.
- Paper egg cartons
- Junk mail; remove cellophane windows
- Magazines and catalogs
- Books, including paperback, hardcover, and phone books.

**Aluminum, glass, and plastic:** *Rinse all containers before disposal; remove caps. No need to remove labels.*

- Plastics #1- #7, up to 3 gallons.  
**NO:** toys, flower pots, or bags.
- Glass bottles and jars of any color.  
**NO:** light bulbs or drinking glasses.
- Aluminum and tin cans, including empty (nontoxic) aerosol cans and foil food trays. **NO:** pots and pans
- Waxed paper cartons, such as milk and juice cartons
- Aseptic containers, such as milk and juice boxes (remove caps and straws)
- Containers from personal hygiene products

## SPECIAL

**Antifreeze:** Clean (not mixed with motor oil)

### Appliances containing Freon:

Including refrigerators, freezers, air conditioners, and dehumidifiers

**Batteries:** Household batteries should go in the electronics container.

**Brush:** Up to 3" in diameter. No stumps, leaves, logs, or wood chips.

**Bulky Waste:** Large items such as furniture, mattresses and box springs, and large toys go in the bulky waste bin; no electronics.

**Demolition materials:** Asphalt, concrete, tile, brick, etc. go behind the scrap metal bin. No stones or dirt. Limited amounts of lumber, wallboard, and other large building materials may be discarded at the town garage. Call 860-663-1765 to arrange.

**Scrap metal :** Items that are mainly metal, such as bike and bed frames, file cabinets, and appliances that do not contain Freon or electronics.

**Tires:** Car tires only; no truck tires.

**Waste oil:** Used motor oil, #2 fuel oil, kerosene, diesel fuel oil, strained cooking oil, and power-steering fluid. Speak with attendant before depositing.
