Continuation of Regular Meeting
#14-4

April 16, 2014

Chairman Rockwell called the meeting to order at 05:25 p.m. at 318 Roast Meat Hill Road.

Members present: T. Doyle, G. Rockwell

Members absent: E. Auer, D. Cronin, G. Johnson, C. Reimers

Visitors: Mr. and Mrs. Salafia (at 318 Roast Meat Hill Road); Mr. Roger Nemergut (at 12 Fire Tower Road).

This site was extensively regraded about forty years ago. When Wolf Hollow Road was paved, two underdrains were installed which discharge onto this site. Water runs across the site from north to south due to the discharge of the most westerly underdrain. This water impinges on the site of the engineered septic system. Some water also runs east from this underdrain and joins the discharge from the second Wolf Hollow Road underdrain, which then flows to the reservoir via an old culvert under Roast Meat Hill Road. This culvert and the stream on the Connecticut Water Company land which it discharges to are severely blocked by siltation and cannot accommodate the peak run-off volumes, resulting in a southerly flow across the property after each significant rain storm.

There do not appear to be any wetland soils on the property.

In view of the complicated nature of the drainage problems, we recommended that the Salafias employ a civil engineer to advise them on the most cost-effective way to revise the drainage, and on the protection of the septic system.

The meeting moved to 12 Fire Tower Road, Killingworth at 6:15 PM. The same members were present.

At 12 Fire Tower Road, Mr. Roger Nemergut, acting as agent for the applicant, showed us the areas of the property which would be used for the tours. Existing drives and parking areas and existing dining and rest room facilities would be used.

No motions were made, no votes were taken, and no communications were received.

The meeting adjourned at 6:45 PM.
