February 9, 2016

Chairwoman Carolyn Reimers called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

Enforcement Officer C. Jefferson was also present.

Minutes: The minutes of the January 12, 2016 Regular Meeting were approved by a consensus of the members.

Enforcement Officer's Report: Cathie Jefferson reported on the following:

- 1) She spoke with Michael Berkun about the information that this commission is requiring from him for his remediation of the area around the recently installed shed on Roast Meat Hill Road. Mrs. Jefferson discussed with him the plan that must be submitted on or before March 1st, giving details about the number of, and kinds of plants, shrubs and trees that will be planted in the buffer area. This is a condition of the after-the-fact permit that was granted at the January IWWC meeting.

- 3) She spoke about the Bull Bag business on Route 80 that will be submitting information for a new building, with activities related to it, in the near future.

OLD BUSINESS

A. Jack B. Coy LLC (owner), Katherine Berkun (applicant) permit application for pond clean-up and removal of soil and debris – Roast Meat Hill Road, Map 28, Lot 59A

This activity was determined to be an as-of-right activity at a previous meeting. The applicants will submit a site plan in the near future.

B. Phase II, Wettish property improvements - Parker Hill Road Ext.

Enforcement Officer Cathie Jefferson researched when this activity was discussed and/or acted on by this commission. She found that in 2011, when the plan was first presented, the Planning & Zoning Commission wanted a detailed plan of all activity before they would approve the project. The Killingworth Park & Recreation Commission withdrew their P&Z application because the drainage in the area was a concern and had to be dealt with before they could complete their plans. A member of the Park & Rec Commission was called to ask if they wanted to withdraw their application from the IWWC also. The call was not returned and no additional information was submitted. This commission denied the application because it was incomplete. Any work that is being considered now will have to be submitted as a new application. Commission member Glen Johnson said that funding sources are being looked into before any plans can be discussed or submitted for review.
